1. Ulcerative colitis (UC) is an inflammatory condition affecting part or all of the large intestine, namely, the colon and the rectum.
2. Its symptoms, which range from mild to severe, may occur in x single episodes though x frequent flare-ups are also common.
3. This condition can be recognized by x three classic symptoms: x persistent diarrhea that is bloody and/or full of x mucus, x painful abdominal cramps in the lower abdomen, and x/a fever arising from the inflammation.
4. x fatigue and x loss of appetite and/or weight, in addition to x other symptoms that are not directly colon-related, such as x inflammation of the eyes, may also occur.
5. x UC is generally diagnosed by x three tests: x/a sigmoidoscopy, colonoscopy, or barium enema.
6. x/a sigmoidoscopy allows x/the direct observation of the lower intestinal tract, i.e. the sigmoid colon and rectum, while x/a colonoscopy permits examination of the entire colon (up to the end of the small intestine).
7. the third commonly used test, x/a barium enema, involves a series of x-rays that are taken once x barium dye has been ingested.
8. a number of options are available for x treatment.
9. These include x medications, such as x 5-ASA compounds, steroids and immunosuppressants.
10. x alternative mind/body treatments, such as x biofeedback, may also be suggested.
11. However, x patients with x severe cases may require x/a colonectomy, or x/the removal of the entire colon.
