

HSC Safety Tips No. (1)

1. Your "Lab Coat" is the first item in your Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) list. Thus, it should be worn **ONLY** when you need protection i.e. when you are in the laboratories and/or in the clinics. **Do NOT** wear lab coats in public places, such as offices, classrooms, canteens (cafeteria), lounges, meeting rooms or elsewhere, as they contaminate these areas with hazardous and infectious materials.



- **2. Do NOT** wear lab coats unbuttoned. An open lab coat is an invitation for hazardous exposures. Avoid lab coats that have openings for access to pant pockets. This can compromise your safety.
- 3. ALWAYS consult the Manufacturer's Material Safety Data Sheet (MMSDS) prior to handling and storage of chemicals.
- **4.** Your "Gloves" should be both suitable and compatible for the operation(s) performed in the laboratory and/or clinic.
- 5. ALWAYS wash your hands before and after removing your gloves.
